Write a character description of the Bronze Age picture in the resources folder on seesaw. Check out the art ideas for drawing your own menagerie, I've left instructions in the topic Seesaw folder.
Complete the reading task from the resources folder on Seesaw.	Times table challenge, take a picture or a screenshot of your score and upload to seesaw.
